PLENARY SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

LINDA VILLAROSA: KEYNOTE SPEAKER / AFTERNOON PLENARY

Journalist Linda Villarosa is a contributing writer for *The New York Times Magazine*, where she covers race, inequality and public health. A former executive editor of *Essence Magazine*, she is the author of the book *Under the Skin: The Hidden Toll of Racism on American Lives and on the Health of Our Nation*. Villarosa's contribution to *The New York Times'* Pulitzer Prizewinning 1619 Project highlighted race-based physiological myths that have endured in medical practice since slavery. A member of the Association of LGBTQ Journalists (NLGJA) Hall of Fame, Villarosa is a graduate of the Craig Newmark Graduate School of Journalism at CUNY, where she is a professor and journalist in residence. She also teaches Pre-Med, English and Black Studies at the City College of New York.

DONALD COHEN: KEYNOTE SPEAKER / MORNING PLENARY

Donald Cohen is the founder and executive director of In the Public Interest, a national resource and policy center on privatization and responsible contracting. He is the co-author (with Allen Mikaelian) of *The Privatization of Everything* and (with Nick Hanauer, Joan Walsh, and Zachary Roth) of *It's Never Our Fault (And Other Shameless Excuses)*. Donald was a founding board member of the Partnership for Working Families (recently renamed to PowerSwitch Action). He is the former Political Director of the San Diego-Imperial Counties Labor Council and founder and executive director of the Center on Policy Initiatives, a San Diego-based think tank and policy organization. He is currently on the board of the Ballot Initiatives Strategy Center. His opinion pieces and articles have appeared in the New York Times, Reuters, the Los Angeles Times, The San Diego Union-Tribune, The New York Daily News, and other online and print outlets.

Donald Cohen's presentation will be followed by an update on PNHP's anti-privatization work from **Oliver Fein, MD**, a past president of PNHP, chair of the New York Metro chapter, and professor emeritus and former associate dean at Weill Cornell Medical College.

SUSAN ROGERS, MD: MEETING CHAIR

Dr. Susan Rogers, president of Physicians for a National Health Program, is recently retired from Stroger Hospital of Cook County, but continues as a volunteer attending hospitalist and internist there. While at Stroger Hospital, she was co-director of medical student programs for the Department of Medicine and received numerous teaching awards from medical students and residents. She is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at Rush University, where she continues to be an active member of the Committee of Admissions. Dr. Rogers received her medical degree from the University of Illinois College of Medicine and completed her residency at Cook County Hospital, where she served an additional year as Chief Resident. She is a national board member of Physicians for a National Health Program and a past co-president of Health Care for All Illinois. She previously was Medical Director of the Near North Health Service Corp, a FQHC in Chicago, and remained on their board for many years after she left her directorship there. Dr. Rogers is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, and a member of the National Medical Association.

HEALTH POLICY UPDATE / MORNING PLENARY

Adam Gaffney, MD, MPH, is immediate past president of PNHP. He is a pulmonary and critical care specialist at Cambridge Health Alliance and instructor in medicine at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Gaffney was also co-chair of the Working Group on Single-Payer Program Design, which developed the "Physicians' Proposal for Single-Payer Health Care Reform," published in the American Journal of Public Health in 2016. His writing has appeared in the Washington Post, Guardian U.S., New Republic, Los Angeles Review of Books, USA Today, and elsewhere. His most recent book, *To Heal Humankind: The Right to Health in History*, was published by Routledge in 2017. Dr. Gaffney completed his medical degree at the New York University School of Medicine, his residency training at Columbia University Medical Center, and a clinical and research fellowship in pulmonary and critical care medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital.

Donald Bourne, MPH, is a MD-PhD student in Health Services Research and Policy at the University of Pittsburgh. His dissertation research focuses on the Pennsylvania Rural Health Model. He is currently funded through a pre-doctoral TL1 Clinical and Translational Science Fellowship. Previously, Donald worked as a Research Associate for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Evidence Synthesis Program, where he conducted systematic reviews on health services research of particular interest to Veterans. He holds an MPH in Epidemiology from Oregon Health & Science University and a BS in Microbiology from Oregon State University.

Suzanne Gordon is senior policy fellow at the Veterans Health Care Policy Institute.

Andrew Hyatt, MD, is an advisor to PNHP's Board of Directors and previously served on the executive committee of the Committee of Interns and Residents (CIR-SEIU).

Moderator: Philip Verhoef, MD, PhD, president-elect of PNHP, is a physician-scientist who divides his time between caring for patients in the pediatric and adult intensive care units at Kaiser Foundation Hospital and Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women and Children, serving as associate program director for the Kaiser Permanente Hawaii Internal Medicine Residency. He also has an appointment as a clinical assistant professor of Medicine at the University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine. Prior to moving to Hawaii, Dr. Verhoef was an assistant professor of medicine and pediatrics at the University of Chicago. While in Chicago, he served as president of the PNHP-IL chapter, president of the Illinois Single Payer Coalition, and as faculty advisor for the Pritzker School of Medicine SNaHP chapter since its inception. His healthcare reform and single-payer-related publications include letters, op-eds, and editorials in the *Annals of Internal Medicine, Chest*, the *Chicago Sun-Times*, the *Springfield Journal Register*, and kevinmd.com. Dr. Verhoef earned a BA in chemistry and biology from the College of Wooster (OH), followed by his MD and PhD in pharmacology from Case Western Reserve University. He then completed his residency training in Internal Medicine-Pediatrics at UCLA, followed by subspecialty training in pediatric and adult critical care medicine at Univ. of Chicago.
